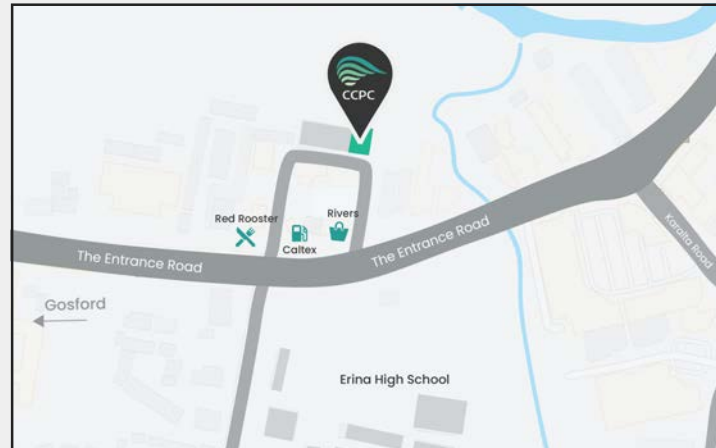
Central Coast Primary Care, also referred to as CCPC, is a local not-for-profit organisation that delivers healthcare programs and community services to the people of the Central Coast.
