



Why is Cervical Screening Important?

Cervical cancer is preventable with regular cervical screening. The Cervical Screening Test detects human papillomavirus (also known as HPV). Ensuring that you have this screening when it is due ensures that your healthcare provider can monitor the infection if it is detected and intervene if there are any changes to cells in your cervix.

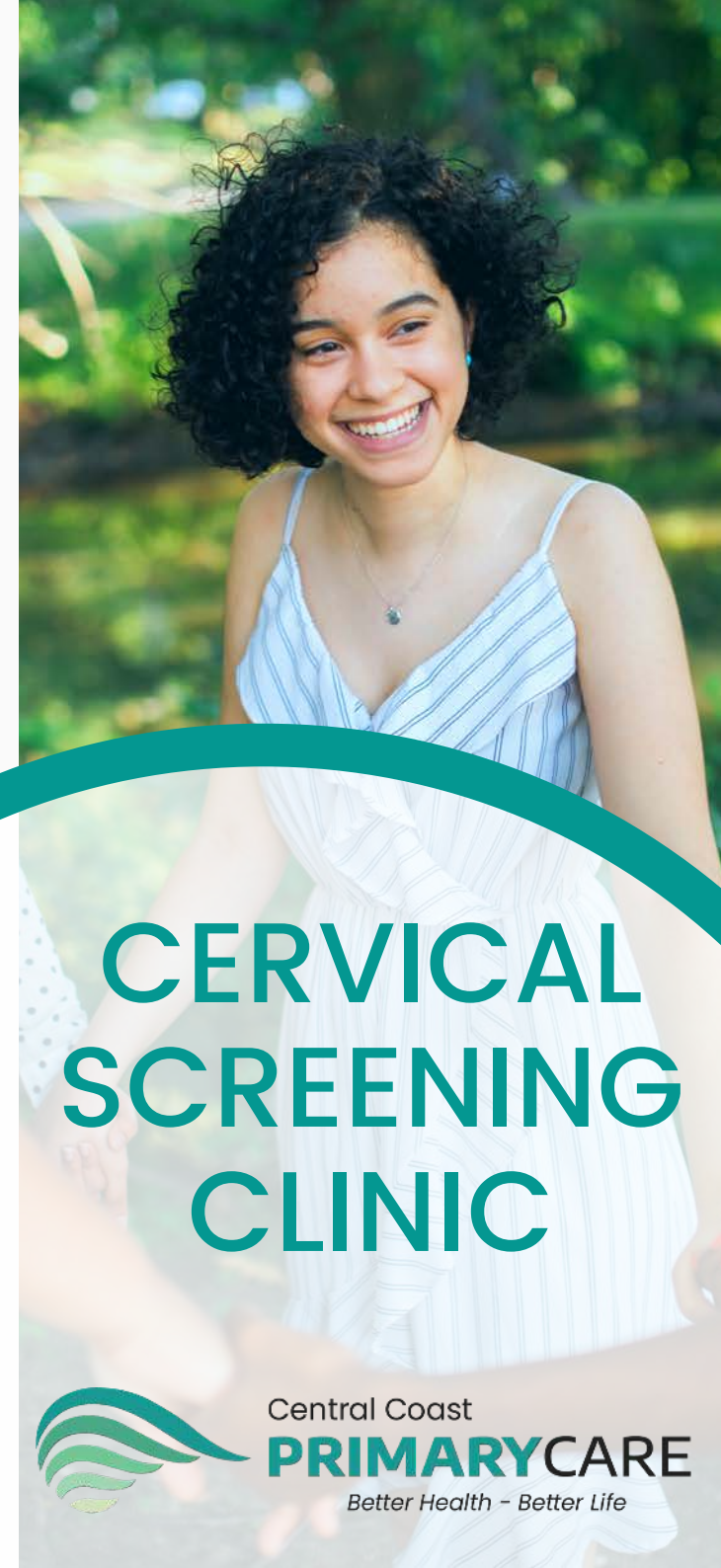

About the Clinic

The Cervical Screening Outreach Clinic provides:

- Cervical Screening Test
- Breast Checks
- Female GPs
- Bulk Billing

If you are a woman aged 25-74 years of age and have ever been sexually active you should have a Cervical Screening Test every five years until the age of 74.

Your first Cervical Screening Test is due at 25 years of age or two years after your last Pap test. If your result is normal you will be due in five years to have your next test. The test is a simple procedure to check the health of your cervix.

Clinic Location and Hours

Appointments are essential.

Located at Wyong Central Community Health Centre, Level 1 38A Pacific Highway, Wyong

Open every Wednesday 9am-4pm.

Only cervical screening tests and breast checks are provided at this clinic. You are encouraged to see your regular GP for all other care.

Helpful hints

You will be contacted by phone one day before your appointment to confirm your booking.

Allow approximately half an hour for your visit and be sure you will not have a period on that day and be aware the date of your last period.
